Do you want to do something now to improve women's lives and health? Do you want to learn how to be an effective advocate on the local or national level? If so, then the Young Women's leadership Project is for you! We want to empower you with volunteer projects, learning experiences, workshops, and the mutual exchange of ideas – *so that you can find your own way in protecting and advancing women's health.*

#### What is the Young Women's Leadership Project?

Started in 1999 by the Feminist Women's Health Center, the Young Women's Leadership Project is a great opportunity to meet with young women from all walks of life, and to prepare for activism, advocacy, or organizational leadership. You will have an opportunity to develop hands-on skills, including: how to advocate for social justice and women's rights, powerful event planning, and how to recruit new activists, all while energizing and diversifying Atlanta's reproductive health and justice movement.

#### Get Educated.

*Sign up for one of our workshops today.*

Our workshops are participatory, such that dialogue and putting your skills to use, are an essential part of the process.

- **Focus on Feminist (step 1)**

Covers current national and state-level politics, the history of the women's health and reproductive freedom movements, grassroots organizing, and more. This is our introductory workshop.



- **Voice for Choice I (step 2)**

Explore current women's health and justice issues in small-group discussions. Includes leadership development, learning to organize, and how to become a powerful "Voice for Choice!"

- **Voice for Choice II (step 3)**

Hone your activist skills! This training will further your abilities in developing leaders, group process, thinking and working strategically, and much, much more!

- **Citizen Advocacy (in December)**

De-mystifies the political process and makes it easy to become an advocate, including how to lobby your state legislator, and learning how a bill becomes a law.
